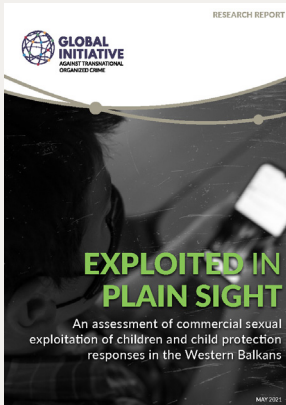

It underscores both the continuing importance of smuggling from and through these countries and the impact of conflict, insecurity and the COVID-19 pandemic on this industry but also its resilience in the face of these phenomena.

PREVENTING VULNERABILITY OF AND STRENGTHENING POLICY RESPONSES FOR COMMERCIAL SEXUAL EXPLOITATION OF CHILDREN

Astra and the Global Initiative Against Transnational Organized Crime (GI-TOC) will present a regional assessment of commercial sexual exploitation of children (CSEC) in the Western Balkans.

This study analyzes the vulnerability of children subject to commercial sexual exploitation. Particular attention was put on child sexual exploitation online and the risk of sexual exploitation of children in specific areas, such as in the travel and tourism sector, in marginalized communities and during migration, amongst others. The study also analyses the child protection system and capacity of law enforcement to tackle the problem, as well as the awareness and preparedness of government institutions, civil society and private sector to deal with child sexual exploitation.

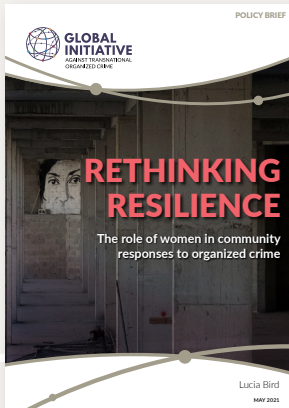

As well as the threats and intimidation they face from criminal groups, civil society organizations also face challenges in accessing funds, associated with the implementation of policies designed to mitigate money laundering (ML) and terrorist financing (TF) risk.

This event will present examples of the challenges faced by civil society as included in a new report to be published by the GI-TOC, and the principal multilateral policy bodies will explain how policy coherence to address the challenge is being developed and implemented.
