The COVID-19 crisis had a significant impact on global ASM gold supply chains during 2020, highlighting not only the vulnerability of mining communities to supply chain disruptions and price shocks, but also the resiliency of illicit gold markets.



In this webinar the author of the GI-TOC's May 2021 Report "Illicit gold markets in east and southern Africa" will discuss the reports findings on market dynamics, supply chains, and actors involved in the illicit gold trade. Not only does the report shed light on criminal networks exploiting the informal nature of the artisanal and small-scale gold mining sector, but also how the illicit gold trade is driven by corruption and in some cases linked to conflict and violence.
