While gold is often referred to as a 'blood mineral' due to its role in conflict financing, the relationship between the gold sector, organized crime, and instability and violence in West Africa and the Sahel is far more nuanced. Woven into the region's convoluted web of actors, activities and supply chains are criminal networks exploiting the gold sector for financial gain and power. The pervasiveness of artisanal and small-scale gold mining and an increasing tide of insecurity and violence in recent years adds to the complexity of the sector. This event will present research on hotspots, criminal networks and supply chains in the region, as well as analysis of the relationships between gold, conflict and criminality. It will also present and discuss implications for prevention and responses, presenting lessons learned and ongoing efforts in the region.
