The rapid global expansion of synthetic drug manufacture, trafficking and use requires governments to develop effective law enforcement strategies. The journey of synthetic drugs encompasses the trade in precursors, production, trafficking and consumption. This journey serves as the basis for explaining the Dutch approach to combating subversive drug-related crime, employing a whole-of-society strategy. During this side event, the Dutch law enforcement strategy will be contextualized within a broader international cooperation perspective by emphasizing collaboration with neighbouring countries, with a special focus on Belgium.


