

1. OBJECTIVE

Establish an operational framework to guide the planning, implementation and monitoring of the actions of the Coalition of Mayors, promoting efficient coordination and consolidating its work during the first year.

2. VALIDITY

One year, from September 30, 2025 to October 1, 2026.

3. STRATEGIC LINES

For the first year of operation, the Action Plan prioritizes three main lines of work: identifying environmental damage caused by organized crime and success stories in the fight against illegal economies, promoting advocacy actions, and strengthening the internal functioning of the Coalition and its sustainability.

Objective: To identify the environmental damage associated with the different criminal markets in each member city of the coalition, simultaneously strengthening local capacities to deal with them effectively.


