The Resilience Fund was launched in the margins of the UN Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice (CCPCJ) in May 2019 and has been involved in activities at every subsequent CCPCJ. The Fund is a unique civil society support mechanism that builds resilience around the world through community-led initiatives.

At last year's CCPCJ session, the Global Initiative Against Transnational Organized Crime (GI-TOC) published the report 'Resilience in action: Civil society's role in preventing and combating organized crime', which was submitted as a contribution to the 15th UN Crime Congress. Since the report was published, the circumstances faced by civil society organizations working to counter organized crime have become even more challenging and unstable in many parts of the world.

This event will provide a key platform for civil society representatives from the Resilience Fund network to reflect on their recent experiences and share updates with CCPCJ participants regarding the challenges they face amid global and local instability, and the ongoing expansion of organized crime.

Speakers' bios

- **Kseniia Tkachuk – LEAD Foundation, Ukraine**

Kseniia Tkachuk works on justice reform, trauma-informed approaches and post-conflict recovery. As founder and head of the L.E.A.D. Foundation, she leads initiatives focused on therapeutic and rehabilitative justice for veterans and trauma-affected individuals, working closely with public institutions on legislative and policy reform.

She has also worked extensively on legal education and mentorship programmes with the Leavitt Institute for International Development. Kseniia holds an LLM in Rule of Law for Development from Loyola University Chicago.

- **Mossaad Mohamed Ali – African Centre for Justice and Peace Studies, Sudan**

Mossaad Mohamed Ali is a human rights lawyer and conflict resolution specialist. He currently serves as executive director of the African Centre for Justice and Peace Studies and previously led the Amel Centre for the Treatment and Rehabilitation of Victims of Torture.

His work has focused on advancing peace and justice through advocacy with institutions, including the UN and the African Commission for Human and Peoples' Rights. In 2007, he received the Olof Palme Human Rights and Peace Prize alongside former UN Secretary-General Kofi Annan.

- **Marlene Angelina León Fontes – Iniciativa Sinaloa, Mexico**

Marlene León Fontes is executive director of Iniciativa Sinaloa, a civil society organization focused on transparency, anti-corruption and accountability. Through her work, she has promoted investigations and legal actions related to possible corruption cases in Sinaloa and Mexico's border states.

She holds degrees in international studies and law, is a UNDP Fellow on the 2030 Agenda and Open Government, and is co-author of the book *Oral Trials in the Mexican Legal System: Challenges to the Administration of Justice*.

- **Juan Enamorado – Warriors Zulu Nation, Honduras**

Juan Enamorado (Jc Rock) is a cultural leader and researcher whose work focuses on violence prevention, youth protection and community responses to organized crime. He is the co-founder and executive director of Warriors Zulu Nation Honduras, which uses hip-hop and urban arts to address forced recruitment and internal displacement. His work explores the impact of organized crime on young people in contexts of violence and displacement. He is also the executive producer of the documentary 'La Danza de las Balas' and contributes to international initiatives on displacement and youth employment.

- **Kareen Ulysse – Centre Hospitalier de Fontaine Foundation, Haiti**

G. Kareen Ulysse is the founder and executive director of the Centre Hospitalier de Fontaine Foundation, which works to expand access to healthcare, education and workforce development in underserved communities. She also serves as chief operating officer of Fontaine Hospital, where she oversees programmes including mobile clinics, child protection services and disaster response initiatives. Her work was featured in the Al Jazeera Witness documentary 'Healing Haiti's Children'.

- **Sreykev Im – APLE, Cambodia**

Sreykev Im works on child protection and online safety as a content analyst at APLE. Her work focuses on content moderation, incident response, and protection services related to child sexual exploitation and harmful online content. She also collaborates with NGOs, caregivers and government stakeholders, and has led training initiatives on child protection and online safety for children, youth and front line workers.

- **Al Fadhil Bin Syarifuddin – Yayasan Geutanyoe, Indonesia**

Al Fadhil is the director of Yayasan Geutanyoe, a civil society organization working on humanitarian assistance, protection and community resilience for vulnerable and conflict-affected communities.

With nearly two decades of experience in the humanitarian and development sectors, he has worked on child protection, migration management, disaster response and social protection with organizations including IOM, Save the Children, UNDP and AusAID.
